The historic church in the heart of Sydney was built in 1843. It seats 800 people. The organ, built in 1910, is a fully restored Hill and Son organ and is often used for concerts.

We understand Jesus as one of the channels through which God is made known to humanity.

Pitt Street is a community of justice-seeking friends. Grounded in our faith, we are involved in justice and service activities.
