Whilst we are predominately an older congregation we warmly welcome people of all ages and are working to reflect the gifts and interests of all.


Younger People

As a symbol of this we have recently revamped the 'Children's' area of the church building, with soft furnishings and resources for play and expression, bringing children symbolically and literally closer to the centre of the Church.



Visitors

Refugees



Pitt Street is a strong supporter of and advocate for refugees and people seeking asylum in Australia. Over a period of years we have assisted a number of individuals including making representations to the Department of Immigration. In addition we have joined other people of faith and community groups in public rallies to support a change of government policies. The Australian government continues to imprison 500 people on Manus Island and Nauru. We believe the camps should be closed and these people immediately brought to Australia.



Organisational Structure.


The Church Council
