ACT OF RECOGNITION

(from the back of the church prior to the procession read by the liturgist)

Today, 26 January 2025, we are marking the Day of Mourning. We acknowledge the Gadigal elders past and present, upon whose land the Pitt Street Uniting Church stands. This is the sovereign and unceded country of the Gadigal, the People of the Grasstree. This country came into the church's possession by deceitful, murderous and immoral means. We acknowledge the continuing sovereignty of the Gadigal over this country and the rights and responsibilities of the Gadigal elders, past and present, to care for it according to the wisdom passed down over more than four thousand generations. We give thanks for the ancestors who formed this land and gifted it to the Gadigal to care for.

We commit ourselves to work and to pray towards a more just settlement for all Indigenous people.

CALL TO WORSHIP

God is alive amongst all of creation.

The sounds of the rivers in motion, the waves of the seas. The scents of the gum trees and native flowers on the winds.

You made the earth to give us life and daily sustenance and it is on Country that we find a place to retreat and walk alongside you in whispering conversation.

Today we come together, and we bring our full voices, to lift them in praise of our triune God.

Let our voices mingle with those of the earth;

may our hearts join the beat of her joy,

for our God is with us:

the Source of all being surrounds and upholds us.

Voice 3: We acknowledge with sorrow that in our own time the injustice and abuse has continued.

We have been indifferent when we should have been outraged, we have been apathetic when we should have been active, we have been silent when we should have spoken out.

Gracious God, forgive us for our failures, past and present.

By your Spirit transform our minds and hearts so that we may boldly speak your truth and courageously do your will.

Through Jesus, the Christ.

WORDS OF ASSURANCE


Water for First Peoples is always a sign of God's peace and fulfilment in everything that is good. The promise of food, of harmony with ourselves, and the creation around us.
