Through the Holy Spirit may this bread and wine be for us the body and life-blood of Christ: so that our hearts and lives may be renewed, the breaches of our world repaired, and all creation sing the song of resurrection.

Restore and heal all that is wounded. Be present in the stillness of the waiting. Roll back the stone of prejudice and fear. Release the signs of new life. Amen.
