

As we light the Christ candles, we acknowledge our concern for Gaza and Ukraine, for persecuted people in other countries.



We know the hurt they have created and the toll they have taken. We feel the weight of that failure, of those shortcomings, of the harm done.






Gracious and loving God, help us to trust your grace.


That we may know ourselves yet not be afraid.

for we are a pilgrim people, ever on the move, called to be responsive to the unsettling, grace-filled, loving Spirit that moves through all.


#### a second candle is lit
